Doug Longhurst: My wife and I are currently viewing houses to buy in Summerland for our retirement. If the OCP is changed so radically as to allow for this project it will undermine the entire zoning framework of the city and put every home at risk of a similar radical change. How could we purchase with any certainty that what we see is what we will get, based on the OCP and zoning bylaws? Make them use land already zoned for this or a similar use.

Milan Brankovic: Yet another age, rentals, etc. restricted residential building, but this time of monstrous proportions. Why gearing everything toward seniors? Do you expect seniors to create new jobs, and prop up the local economy? Why not attracting businesses? And you can't attract them if they can't recruit workforce due to the lack of accommodation for younger workers. Therefore, I'm voicing my opposition to this project.

Just to clarify, I currently live in Alberta, but I'm also a property owner/taxpayer in Summerland.

Gail Mully: The proposed development of 13610 Banks Crescent is a violation of the Mayor and Council's promise to protect agricultural land. Period!

Kendal Wilson: It would be disgraceful for the Summerland council to allow a corporation to endanger the future of the aquifer, and the hatchery.

Melissa Goldie: Please don't damage the ecosystem here and change the lives of all of the residents for the worse. This facility would be much better off closer to the amenities of Penticton

Anonymous: I am not against the development ... just it's location ... there must be a better spot somewhere in this town.

Karyn & Andrew Massey: Save the integrity of the residential and agricultural land. This complex is better suited to main town because of the large number of staff and assisted residences. The high density residences and visitors would further benefit small business in main town and help it to thrive. The ambulance would be closer and not have to cross the highway twice before heading off to Penticton.

Randy Meinert: The 135 units that are designated for seniors like my mother, who lives in Summerland, will be too expensive to be a solution to the seniors housing shortage, The community problem will not be solved.

Amber Sather:

The fish hatchery will affect my fishing in the area of the Okanagan and if that gets shut down then I will no longer be buying my fishing license, so less revenue for upkeep for freshwater fisheries society.

Would you want to be an elderly person/couple stuck in a bowl with no way to walk out safely? Also the job influx will only be temporary when the building is being made. Not as many permanent, quality jobs once completed, as the builder claims.
