

## Transit in Summerland

The Summerland transit system is cost shared with BC Transit and available Monday - Friday excluding holidays.

### Bus Service



Summerland has a scheduled fixed route service available for travel in Summerland, Trout Creek and to Penticton and back (Route 30). Bus stops are marked with a sign and a red curb. Schedules are available at

Municipal Hall and on our website. The bus operates Monday - Friday excluding holidays. A one-way fare to Penticton (or the Southern region) is \$4.00 and within Summerland is \$2.25. Day passes are \$8.00. Children under ten are free. Ten ticket passes or monthly passes are also available. Tickets can be purchased at Municipal Hall, the Aquatic Centre or directly from the driver (if you have exact change).

**\*\*Please note: Southbound scheduled departures from Victoria/Jubilee Rd shifted to 3:07pm to accommodate student travel to Penticton.**

### On Request Service

On Request Service is a curb to curb transit service that has replaced the previous door to door handyDART Service. Customers will be picked up and taken to their destination. This service is used for appointments but can also be used for social visits based on availability and priority. Service within Summerland or to Penticton must be **prebooked** by calling 250-492-5814. One-way fares are \$2.25 in Summerland and \$4.00 to Penticton. If you have an attendant, they travel for free. Be sure to book early as space and times are limited.

### Taxi Saver Program

Taxi Saver Coupons are available to people over the age of 65 or for individuals with physical or mental disabilities. Eligible individuals can purchase an \$80 sheet of Taxi Saver Coupons to be used with Summerland Taxi at a cost of \$40 (a 50% subsidy). One sheet is permitted per month. Coupons are not transferable. Application forms are available at Municipal Hall.

## Heritage Week February 19 –25 Heritage Stands the Test of Time

As part of Canada's Heritage Week, well-known Kettle Valley Railway historian Joe Smuin will give a talk on "An infinitesimal bridge" -- *The Trout Creek Canyon Bridge*, Saturday, February 24.

The free presentation will start at 1 p.m. at the Service Station at the Lakeside Church in Lower Town, 5505 Butler Street. Seating is limited to 100 people and is on a first come, first served basis. The focus will be on the history of the century-old trestle bridge and the urgent need for \$600,000 required this year to maintain it. Donations are welcome and will benefit the Kettle Valley Railway Society.

The Summerland Heritage Advisory Commission will host this event along with the Service Station, KVRS Society, Okanagan Historical Society and the Summerland Museum.

### It Takes All Sorts: Recycling Contamination Down 1/3!

Between July & October 2017, Summerland residents reduced the amount of contamination in the curbside recycling by one-third! Taking the time to properly sort meant that items that aren't part of the RecycleBC program such as clothes, chip bags, toys, napkins, etc. dropped by 33.8% and the amount of depot-only (soft plastics, styrofoam, glass) and unsortable (tied in grocery bags, or a metal can inside a plastic tub) materials being placed in the curbside collection dropped by 31.3%. Great work to everyone who made the extra effort to Recycle Right!

This drop represents excellent progress, but there's still a long way to go! Summerland's contamination rate is much higher than it should be, making us subject to fines from RecycleBC. To help us build on the momentum achieved in 2017, we're launching a survey to gather your feedback regarding curbside recycling.
