- In each billing cycle, produced energy will be credited at the corresponding energy charge of the rate code for the customer type (residential) until the customer reaches net-zero (i.e., to a maximum of the customer's consumption in that billing cycle);
- ii. Produced energy in excess of consumption will carry forward to the next billing cycle as 'banked' kWh's. Any 'banked' kWh's remaining at the end of the calendar year will be credited to the customer at the prevailing avoided cost of energy purchase.

The following charges are in addition to the general *Tipping Fee* charges outlined above in 1.0 to 1.4, and shall also apply:

2.1. To open the landfill during closed hours \$ 125.00 plus Staff Time

2.1.1. Staff Time:

a. Regular time, one hour minimum \$60.00/hr
b. Call out, two hour minimum \$85.00/hr
c. Additional overtime \$85.00/hr

- 2.2. Solid Waste that is Disposed of in a Designated Location at the Site contrary to the directions indicated by posted notices, signs, and other Site communication tools and/or directed by the Site Official shall be charged four times the rate for Refuse, or four times the highest rate for any material contained in the load, whichever is greater, with a minimum charge of \$20.00.
- 2.3. Any Solid Waste load that is Disposed of in a Designated Location, and that is Contaminated or does not meet Recyclable specifications shall be charged four times the rate for Refuse, or four times the highest rate for any material contained in the load, whichever is greater, with a minimum charge of \$20.00.
- 2.4. *Disposing* of unauthorized *Prohibited Waste* in a manner contrary to the *District* approved protocol shall be charged \$500 per tonne with a \$300 minimum charge, or as determined by the *Director*.
- 2.5. Vehicles hauling unsecured and/or uncovered loads of Solid Waste (see most current District of Summerland Solid Waste Management Regulation Bylaw as amended from time to time, Section 2, shall be charged double the rate for Refuse, or double the highest rate for any material contained in the load, whichever is greater, with a minimum charge of \$15.00.
- 2.6. Any *Mixed Load Disposed* of at the *Site* will be charged at the rate for the component of the load with the highest applicable rate.

- 2.7. Any Garbage that contains more than 1% Recyclable materials by volume, with the exception of Demolition And Renovation Mixed Load and Construction Mixed Load, shall be charged three times the rate for Refuse, or three times the highest rate for any material contained in the load, whichever is greater, with a minimum charge of \$15.00. Any Demolition And Renovation Mixed Load and Construction Mixed Load that contains more than 1% Recyclable materials by volume, other than those materials associated with Demolition, Renovation and Construction Waste, shall be charged three times the rate for Mixed Demolition Waste, with a minimum charge of \$15.00.
- 2.8. The fee for each load of *Agricultural Plastic* that arrives at the *Site* that is not suitably prepared as per *District* policy shall be charged as *Refuse*, with a \$6.85 minimum charge.
- 2.9. Any Garbage that contains Controlled Waste, with the exception of Demolition and Renovation Mixed Load and Construction Mixed Load, shall be charged four times the rate for Refuse, or four times the highest rate for any material contained in the load, whichever is greater, with a minimum charge of \$20.00. Any Demolition And Renovation Mixed Load and Construction Mixed Load that contains Controlled Waste, other than those materials associated with Demolition, Renovation and Construction Waste, shall be charged four times the rate for Mixed Demolition Waste, with a minimum charge of \$20.00.
- 2.10. Any Person who Disposes of Non-Service Area Solid Waste at the Site, without the permission of the *Director*, shall be charged two times the rate for *Refuse*, or two times the highest rate for any material contained in the load, whichever is greater, with a minimum charge of \$20.00.
- 2.11. Each offence committed against the current Solid Waste Management Regulation Bylaw shall be deemed a separate and distinct offence and shall be charged double the normal fee with a minimum charge of \$15.00. In addition, any penalties with the Fees and Charges Bylaw will apply.
- 2.12. Clean Soil is accepted at the Site based on ongoing operational needs and is limited by weather conditions and current inventory. To be used as Clean Soil the material must not exceed the Agricultural soil standards in the BC Contaminated Site Regulation. The soil must be dry and free of organics (brush, roots, logs and branches) and debris such as garbage, concrete, asphalt, and rocks larger than 40 centimetres (16 inches) in any direction (baseball). A lawnmower should be able to

be run over the soil when grass has grown on the clean fill. *Clean Soil* is currently accepted at no charge if it meets these conditions.

2.13. Unscaled Loads:

2.14. Payment

- 2.14.1. The general *Tipping Fee* is per metric tonne per load, or when stated per unit, when each *Solid Waste* is *Source Separated*, not *Contaminated* and *Disposed* in the *Designated Location*.
- 2.14.2. The charge payable under this Schedule shall be paid following the weighing of the empty *Vehicle* after the load is *Disposed* and shall be based on the *Weight-Net*, difference in weight between the *Weight-Gross* and the *Weight-Tare* of the empty *Vehicle*.

- 2.14.3. Notwithstanding Section 2.13 above, in the event the weigh scale is not operational, or at the discretion of the *Director*, the *Landfill Official* shall estimate the weight of each load, and a fee shall be charged as outlined in Sections 1.1 to 1.5 of this Schedule.
- 2.14.4. Any fee that must be paid pursuant to this bylaw at the *Site* or *Recycling Area* shall be paid to the Scale Attendant prior to leaving the *Site*.
- 2.14.5. Notwithstanding Section 2.14.4 above, *Persons* Disposing of *Garbage* at the *Site* on a regular basis may apply to the *Director of Finance* for credit and if granted, then payment of the charges imposed shall be made and the credit extended on condition that:
 - 2.14.5.1. Payment in full shall be received by the *District* within thirty (30) days of the last day of the month for which an invoice has been received. The *District* will invoice monthly for material delivered during the preceding month; the invoice will be based on the disposal rates in effect at the time of delivery.
 - 2.14.5.2. Late payment will be subject to an interest penalty charge of 2.0% per month.
 - 2.14.5.3. The *District* reserves the right to cancel the credit offered herein for any reason whatsoever, including, but not limited to, late payment or non-payment of invoice amounts due and payable, or other justified cause as judged by the *Director of Finance*. In addition, entry into the *Site* may be refused for delinquent credit accounts.

3. DISTRICT OF SUMMERLAND OPERATIONS AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS-RECYCLABLE

- 3.1. The District of Summerland is exempt from Recyclable Metal/Scrap Metal Tipping Fees relating to District Operations and District Local Government Improvement Projects, located within District boundaries provided the materials are suitably prepared, as determined by the Director, prior to delivery and Disposal at the Site.
- 3.2. Notwithstanding Sections 1 and 2 above, the District of Summerland may enter into a contract for the sale of *Compost*, Topdressing or Wood mulch that sets the fees and conditions to be utilized under that contract.

SEWER OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE USER FEE

The sewer operating and maintenance user fee is charged for each unit of sewer effluent discharged. One unit is defined as 900 litres per day which is equivalent to the amount of effluent discharge from an average single family residential dwelling. All users of the sewer system are subject to the charge with the amount of the charge calculated on the estimated sewer effluent discharge of the user.

The user fee will be charged on a monthly basis with a minimum charge of one unit.

Per unit sewer operating and maintenance user fee: \$36.72 per month

Apartment rate sewer operating and maintenance user fee: \$22.04 per month

A two percent (2%) penalty will be applied to the sewer operating and maintenance user fee if paid past the due date as indicated on the utility billing each month.

SEWER CAPITAL USER FEE

The sewer capital user fee is charged for each unit in excess of one unit of sewer effluent discharged. One unit is defined as 900 litres per day which is equivalent to the amount of effluent discharge from an average single family residential dwelling. All properties within the sewer specified area are subject to the charge.

The sewer capital user fee will be charged on an annual basis at the rate of \$225.00 per unit for each unit in excess of one.
