# Nature and Scope of Work

Under the direction of the Director of Community Services, the Maintenance Lifeguard / Instructor reports on day-to-day operations to the Manager of Recreation. As a member of the aquatic leadership team, the full time Maintenance Lifeguard/Instructor is responsible for leading and implementing the Summerland Aquatic & Fitness Centre maintenance program as well as providing aquatic staff responsibilities (lifeguarding, swim lessons, aquatic program instruction, cashiering, etc.).

#### Duties

- 1. As a member of the Aquatic leadership team, coach and mentor aquatic staff and provide day-to-day support, guidance, and leadership of the aquatics staff team as required.
- 2. Assist the Head Lifeguard in coordinating and implementing regular aquatic staff inservice training sessions.
- 3. Provide maintenance program training to staff.
- 4. Coordinate and implement shut down maintenance projects.
- 5. In consultation with the Manager of Recreation and Head Lifeguard, ensure the Pool Safety Plan is updated as required.
- 6. Ensure the health and safety of patrons and staff; follow up with supervisory staff as required.
- 7. Provide day-to-day customer service as required.
- 8. Assist with creating and updating aquatic policies and procedures.
- 9. Assist the Head Lifeguard to implement pool special events.
- 10. Implement Lifeguard-Instructor responsibilities as required including:
  - Lifeguarding and first aid.
  - Instructing programs, lessons, and aquafit.
  - Cashiering and customer service.
- 11. Coordinate the facility maintenance program overseeing daily, weekly, monthly, and annual maintenance requirements and documentation.
- 12. Operate, adjust, and maintain all Aquatic Facility mechanical equipment and maintain daily log.

- 13. Provide support to the Facilities Maintenance Lead Hand in more complex facility maintenance tasks and projects including chlorine tank changes once fully trained.
- 14. Responsible for backwashing filters, testing and maintaining water chemistry, dumping and filling hot tub, vacuuming pool basin, disinfecting pool deck, and other related tasks.
- 15. Performing miscellaneous maintenance in and around the building including fitness room equipment.
- 16. Monitor maintenance supplies and follow up with the Manager of Recreation on purchases.
- 17. Perform janitorial maintenance such as cleaning washrooms, washing and waxing floors, vacuuming, emptying garbage cans, washing windows, cleaning the fitness room, etc.
- 18. Perform other related duties as required.

# **Required Skills and Knowledge**

- 1. Skills and experience supervising/leading staff and demonstrated team building skills.
- 2. Excellent communication and customer service skills.
- 3. Ability to adapt to a work environment with ongoing changes.
- 4. Strong organizational and computer skills.
- 5. Aptitude, agility, and strength to do the required work of this position.
- 6. Strong understanding of pool operations.
- 7. Demonstrated understanding of health and safety requirements in an aquatic environment.
- 8. Knowledge and experience of pool mechanical maintenance, pool chemistry, and equipment repair servicing and operation.
- 9. Knowledge and experience in pool and facility janitorial work.
- 10. Basic knowledge of maintenance of air conditioners, furnaces, and pumps.
- 11. Strong swimmer; in excellent physical condition.

# **Required Qualifications**

- 1. Current Lifesaving Society National Lifeguard Award, Pool Option.
- 2. Current AMOA Certification or willing to obtain.
- 3. Current Lifesaving Society Swim Instructor.
- 4. Aquafit Certification or willing to obtain.
- 5. Aquatic Emergency Care or Standard First Aid CPR 'C'.
- 6. Pool Operators I and II.
- 7. Must meet Provincial Health Act requirements.
- 8. Ability to pass and maintain a Police Information Check including the vulnerable sector section.
- 9. Valid B.C. Driver's License (Class 5).
- 10. Chlorine Handlers Certificate or willing to obtain.

- 11. Experience in operating and maintaining public recreation swimming pools and previous experience as a Lifeguard Instructor or equivalent and cashier experience.
- 12. Upper Level Training Certification (National Lifeguard Instructor and Swim Instructor Trainer, First Aid Instructor/Examiner etc.) and Fitness Instructor training (ie BCRPA or equivalent) would be an asset.

# **Remuneration and Hours of Work**

- 1. Remuneration in accordance with Schedule 'A' of the CUPE Collective Agreement.
- 2. Non-normal shift: 40 hours a week scheduled as required for operations which could include a combination of daytime, evening and weekend hours.
