# Nature and Scope of Work

Reporting to the Public Works Foreman, or other designated individual, the Mechanic performs the following duties, as required:

#### **Duties**

- 1. Diagnose, repair and adjust major and minor mechanical equipment problems on a broad range of District vehicles, including fire department vehicles, ice-resurfacer, dump trucks and loaders and a variety of other heavy to light duty and hybrid equipment. This may take place in the shop or in the field.
- 2. Complete preventative maintenance checks, inspect and identify potential problems and take corrective action, complete tune-ups and routine maintenance on gas and diesel engines.
- 3. Electrical servicing such as replacing lights, plugs, alternators, generators and starters as required.
- 4. Analyze electronic and computer data for trouble shooting, tune ups and adjustments.
- 5. Source and order parts needed for repairs and maintenance.
- 6. Design and fabricate equipment and accessories as required such as snow blade attachments for trucks and equipment.
- 7. May, on occasion, give specific direction to assigned workers.
- 8. Drives service truck and tests equipment and vehicles repaired or adjusted.
- 9. Maintain accurate daily logs of inspections and completed work.
- 10. Adheres to the applicable safety rules and procedures.
- 11. Performs other related duties as required.

## Required Skills and Knowledge

- 1. Necessary knowledge of the techniques, tools, equipment and safety precautions pertaining to the maintenance and operation of vehicles and equipment.
- 2. Necessary knowledge of electric and acetylene welding techniques, tools and equipment.
- 3. Ability to work from diagrams and sketches.

- 4. Ability to exercise courtesy and tact in the exchange of information to coworkers, suppliers and the public.
- 5. Basic computer skills.
- 6. Strong team player with excellent communication skills.
- 7. Physically fit and able to work with heavy, large mechanical parts in the presence of all types of weather conditions.
- 8. Knowledge of WorkSafe and District of Summerland Health, Safety and Environmental policies and procedures.

## **Required Qualifications**

- 1. Grade 12 education or equivalent.
- 2. Minimum 5 years' experience in either Heavy Duty Equipment Technician, Automotive Mechanic or Commercial Transport Mechanic.
- 3. Certified in the Province of B.C. Commercial Vehicle Inspection or willingness to acquire.
- 4. A valid BC or Interprovincial Red Seal Trade Certificate as either a Heavy Duty Equipment Technician, Automotive Service Technician or Commercial Transport Mechanic.
- 5. A valid BC Driver's License Class 3 with Air Endorsement and a clean Driver's abstract.
- 6. Ability to pass and maintain a Police Information Check.
- 7. Valid First Aid Certificate or an ability and willingness to obtain one.

## **Remuneration and Hours of Work**

- 1. Remuneration in accordance with Schedule 'A' of the CUPE Local 1136 Collective Agreement.
- 2. Hours of work in accordance with the CUPE Collective Agreement.
- 3. Overtime hours may be required for equipment repair as required to meet operational needs.
